President-elect Aquino must remember that First Gentleman Jose Miguel Arroyo does not enjoy any congressional or constitutional and/or diplomatic immunity. Hence, Mr. Arroyo can easily be sued as an ordinary Filipino citizen and taxpayer.

If President-elect Aquino will instruct his Secretary of Justice-designate to coordinate with this columnist, it is possible that by July 1, 2010, the first day of office of the new President, a formal case can be filed against Jose Miguel Arroyo and Does 1-100 for fraud and/or economic plunder. The assets of Mike Arroyo, along with all of his bank accounts in the Philippines and abroad can be frozen (or garnished), so that the Philippine government can be able to recover any actual and/or punitive (or moral) damages that may be awarded by the criminal court. With the dossier that this writer can deliver to the Department of Justice (DoJ) of the Philippines, Mr. Arroyo, et al, can be convicted in due time – perhaps in six months or less.

Jose Miguel Arroyo or his estate, if – heaven forbid – he suffers a fatal heart attack during the sentencing, as he has already undergone a heart-bypass surgery. More penalties can be assessed by the Bureau of Internal Revenue (BIR) of the Philippines for tax evasion (plus additional years of imprisonment).

Sharing the Bounty with NGOs
