The Alliance-Philippines (AJLPP) with profound sadness, announces the passing of Ka. Crispin Beltran, 75, last May 20, 2008, in the Philippines.

Ka. Bel, as we fondly called him, was a representative of ANAK-PAWIS Party list group, chair emeritus of the Kilusang Mayo Uno (May First Movement) labor center and was the first chairperson of the International League of Peoples Struggle (ILPS) from 2001-2004.

Statement of Sen. Aquilino Q. Pimentel, Jr., on the Death of Anak Pawis Rep. Crispin Beltran: "We may not agree with Ka Bel's ideology but he fought for common man without counting the cost. His loss is irreparable." As a president of the taxi driver's union, Ka Bel was instrumental in the formation of the KMU in 1980 at the height of the US-Marcos dictatorship. For his labor activism he was jailed in 1982 but escaped and joined the New People's Army from 1984-1986.

He went back to the legal arena when Marcos was overthrown in 1986 and became the chair of the KMU when Rolando Olalia, the KMU and BAYAN chair, was killed by the fascist militarist during the US-Aquino regime.

He was elected as BAYAN MUNA representative in 2001 and again as ANAKPAWIS congressperson in 2006. He was again tortured and jailed by the fascist US-Macapagal-Arroyo regime when GMA declared a "state of emergency" in February 2006. When he was freed he continued his tireless advocacy for the nation and its people.

Ka Bel was a consummate fighter for the Filipino people, a hero of the Filipino working class and the international proletariat. We in the AJLPP and the Filipino community in the United States and in behalf of all our allies, salute him and pay tribute to his greatness,
