The Media Breakfast Club (MBC), in cooperation with the Filipino-American Community of Los Angeles (FACLA), will hold a forum on Monday, March 17, 2008, from 4:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m., at the FACLA Social Hall. The topic will be the New Asian Town of Houston, Texas, as a model for developing the FACLA property and the Historic Filipinotown. The FACLA is located at 1740 W. Temple St., Los Angeles, CA 90026.
